#### **INDICATIONS**

COSENTYX® (secukinumab) is a prescription medicine used to treat:

- people 6 years of age and older with moderate to severe plaque psoriasis (PsO) that involves large areas or many areas of the body, and who may benefit from taking injections or pills (systemic therapy) or phototherapy (treatment using ultraviolet or UV light alone or with systemic therapy)
- people 2 years of age and older with active psoriatic arthritis (PsA)
- adults with active ankylosing spondylitis (AS)
- adults with active non-radiographic axial spondyloarthritis (nr-axSpA) and objective signs of inflammation
- people 4 years of age and older with active enthesitis-related arthritis (ERA)
- adults with moderate to severe hidradenitis suppurativa (HS)

Do not use COSENTYX if you have had a severe allergic reaction to secukinumab or any of the other ingredients in COSENTYX. See the Medication Guide for a complete list of ingredients.

#### **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont)**

What is the most important information I should know about COSENTYX?

COSENTYX is a medicine that affects your immune system. COSENTYX may increase your risk of having serious side effects such as:

#### Infections

COSENTYX may lower the ability of your immune system to fight infections and may increase your risk of infections. Some people have died from these infections.

- Your doctor should check you for tuberculosis (TB) before starting treatment with COSENTYX.
- If your doctor feels that you are at risk for TB, you may be treated with medicine for TB before you begin treatment with COSENTYX and during treatment with COSENTYX.
- Your doctor should watch you closely for signs and symptoms of TB during treatment with COSENTYX. Do not use COSENTYX if you have an active TB infection.



## TARGET MULTIPLE SYMPTOMS OF PSORIATIC ARTHRITIS

### Living with active psoriatic arthritis (PsA) can be frustrating.

Constantly dealing with multiple PsA symptoms, like painful and tender joints, swollen fingers and toes, and sometimes even scaly, itchy skin, can turn your everyday activities into daily challenges. And while you try to power through the pain, it may mean you're missing out on doing the things you love.

That's why if you're still struggling with joint pain, skin plaques, or any of the multiple symptoms of PsA, it's important to take control, and talk to your rheumatologist to see if COSENTYX is right for you.

#### WHAT IS PSORIATIC ARTHRITIS?

Psoriatic arthritis (PsA) is an inflammatory autoimmune condition that can affect both the joints and the skin. While the specific causes of PsA are not fully known, it's believed that there are multiple proteins in your immune system that may play a role in inflammation. When these proteins become overproduced, they cause an inflammatory response that contributes to pain and swelling in the joints and tendons, and sometimes even red, scaly, itchy skin—a symptom of plaque psoriasis (PsO).

PsA is different than rheumatoid arthritis (RA).
PsA joint pain is usually asymmetrical, meaning joint pain doesn't always affect both sides of the body.
RA inflammation is peripheral—meaning it is more likely to affect the wrists, knees, and ankles—and does not typically involve the spine.

### Here's some more helpful information about the connection between PsA and PsO:



Joint pain and psoriasis skin plaques can be symptoms of the same psoriatic condition affecting different parts of the body.



In about 85% of people, skin symptoms occur prior to joint disease.



PsA tends to affect people between the ages of 30 and 55 but can occur earlier or later.





# WHAT ARE THE MULTIPLE SYMPTOMS OF PSORIATIC ARTHRITIS?

### Psoriatic arthritis (PsA) is different from other forms of arthritis and it affects everyone differently.

The same inflammation that causes joint pain and skin plaques can also affect other parts of the body.

Here's a list of the multiple symptoms of PsA:



### Joint pain and swelling, and reduced physical mobility



#### **Enthesitis**

Pain and tenderness where tendons and ligaments attach to bones, making it different than "tennis elhow"



#### **Dactylitis**

Swelling of an entire finger or toe, commonly referred to as "sausage-like."



#### Skin plaques and nail changes

Occur in patients who also have plague psoriasis.




#### Helps stop further joint damage

#### Before starting COSENTYX°, tell your doctor if you:

- are being treated for an infection
- have an infection that does not go away or that keeps coming back
- have TB or have been in close contact with someone with TB
- think you have an infection or have symptoms of an infection such
  as: fevers, sweats, or chills; muscle aches; cough; shortness of
  breath; blood in your phlegm; weight loss; warm, red, or painful
  skin or sores on your body; diarrhea or stomach pain; burning
  when you urinate or urinate more often than normal



# COSENTYX° IS THE FIRST TREATMENT TO TARGET IL-17A

#### WHAT MAKES COSENTYX DIFFERENT?

Psoriatic arthritis (PsA) is the result of an overactive immune system. While the specific causes of PsA are not fully known, it is believed that there are multiple proteins in your immune system, including IL-17A, which may play a role in causing inflammation.

COSENTYX is a different kind of targeted biologic. It's the **#1 prescribed medicine of its kind**,\*† and works within your body to target IL-17A.

#### **EXPERIENCE IN ADULTS**

COSENTYX has been studied extensively in adults for 16 years across all indications. COSENTYX was approved by the US Food and Drug Administration (FDA) in 2015 to treat adults with moderate to severe plaque psoriasis. Then in 2016, it was approved to treat adults with active psoriatic arthritis and active ankylosing spondylitis. Most recently in June 2020, it was approved by the FDA to treat another form of axSpA: nr-axSpA.



# COSENTYX HELPS YOU TAKE ON YOUR DAILY ACTIVITIES SO YOU CAN MOVE FORWARD

Adults in clinical trials completed a questionnaire that asked how difficult it was to complete daily activities. The majority of adults taking COSENTYX showed overall improvement in the ability to perform daily

activities at 16 weeks. The questions covered categories such as:

- · Getting in and out of bed
- · Getting dressed on their own
- Walking
- · Using hands to eat

- Gripping objects
- Reaching
- Taking care of personal hygiene



### COMPLETE REDUCTION OF SWELLING

In a clinical trial, 50% of adults with completely swollen fingers or toes no longer had signs of swelling after 6 months of taking COSENTYX, versus 15% with placebo.

#### IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont)

#### Serious allergic reactions

Serious allergic reactions can occur. Get emergency medical help right away if you get any of the following symptoms: feeling faint; swelling of your face, eyelids, lips, mouth, tongue, or throat; trouble breathing or throat tightness; chest tightness; skin rash or hives (red, itchy bumps).


If you have a severe allergic reaction, do not give another injection of COSENTYX.

#### Inflammatory bowel disease

New cases of inflammatory bowel disease or "flare-ups" can happen with COSENTYX, and can sometimes be serious. If you have inflammatory bowel disease (ulcerative colitis or Crohn's disease), tell your doctor if you have worsening disease symptoms during treatment with COSENTYX or develop new symptoms of stomach pain or diarrhea.

Severe skin reactions that look like eczema can happen during treatment with COSENTYX from days to months after your first dose and can sometimes lead to hospitalization. Your doctor may temporarily stop treatment with COSENTYX if you develop severe skin reactions. Tell your doctor if you have any of the following signs or symptoms: redness or rash; itching; small bumps or patches; your skin is dry or feels like leather; blisters on the hands or feet that ooze or become crusty or skin peeling.

# COSENTYX® TREATS MORE THAN JUST JOINT PAIN

If left untreated, PsA can cause permanent joint damage, also known as radiographic progression. In the largest clinical trial ever conducted for psoriatic arthritis for a biologic drug, COSENTYX was proven to help stop further joint damage.



# 76% of adults taking COSENTYX had no increase in joint damage at 6 months\*

#### **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION (cont)**

The most common side effects of COSENTYX include: cold symptoms, diarrhea, and upper respiratory tract infections.

These are not all of the possible side effects of COSENTYX. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects.

#### Before using COSENTYX, tell your doctor if you:

- have any of the conditions or symptoms listed on page 6 for infections.
- have inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's disease or ulcerative colitis).
- are allergic to latex. The needle cap on the COSENTYX Sensoready® pen, and 150 mg/mL and 75 mg/0.5 mL prefilled syringes contains latex.
- have recently received or are scheduled to receive an immunization (vaccine). People who take COSENTYX
   should not receive live vaccines. Children should be brought up to date with all vaccines before starting COSENTYX.
- have any other medical conditions and all the medicines you take, including prescription and over-the-counter medicines, vitamins, and herbal supplements. Keep a list of your medicines to show your healthcare provider and pharmacist when you get a new medicine.
- are pregnant or plan to become pregnant. It is not known if COSENTYX can harm your unborn baby. You and your doctor should decide if you will use COSENTYX.
- are breastfeeding or plan to breastfeed. It is not known if COSENTYX passes into your breast milk.

#### **CONVENIENT, ONCE-A-MONTH DOSE**

The recommended dose is 150 mg, taken as one injection under the skin.\*

If you have moderate to severe plaque psoriasis or continue to have PsA symptoms, your rheumatologist may prescribe 300 mg (taken as two 150-mg injections).\*



#### INJECTION RESOURCES


